

KodiakCare Rescues Simba from Near-Fatal Disease

Ellie McKenna was out of work from her airport job and surviving on unemployment insurance when she received the heartbreaking news that her French bulldog puppy had a serious disease and required treatment costing \$1,000 a day.

"They gave me the option to put him down and I said, 'No I can't,'" McKenna tearfully recalled. "When I was told he could die any minute, I was like, 'Where am I going to get the money?' It was a horrible experience."

McKenna started a Go-Fund-Me page and asked her family and friends for help, but still came up short. Fortunately, KodiakCare stepped in with a four-figure contribution that made a life-and-death difference for Simba, who narrowly survived a bad case of Leptospirosis.

This bacterial infection attacks major organs and can be challenging to treat. "A lot of dogs don't make it," said Dr. Brandi Lauer, who helped to supervise Simba's care at MSPCA-Angell Animal Medical Center in Boston. "With Lepto, it's up in the air how the dog will respond. The senior doctors have had some very sad cases." A series of vaccinations is needed to provide full protection, and younger dogs like four-month-old Simba are especially vulnerable.

Once Simba's funding was secure, he received antibiotics, a urinary catheter and round-the-clock intensive care for five days. His condition improved from "super-lethargic" to "barking way too much," as 12-pound puppies are apt to do when feeling better, Lauer said.

Simba is now back home and "eating like crazy, doing so wonderfully," McKenna reports. "I can't describe how happy I am. I didn't want to put my dog to sleep. He is like a son to me."

McKenna is spreading the word about KodiakCare on social media, including among French Bulldog affinity groups. "I told them these are the best people. When I can, I want to start donating. If it weren't for you, I would have lost my dog."
